



## JASPER, INDIANA (Dubois County)

Destination Drive, approximately 50 miles round trip.



**Jasper, Indiana**, the county seat of Dubois County, with a population of approx. 16,000 is known as the “Wood Capital of the World” and home to some well-known companies, Masterbrand Cabinets, Kimball International, and Jasper Engines & Transmissions. The annual Jasper Strassenfest takes place August 5-8, 2021 in downtown Jasper. The German-inspired street festival features live entertainment on three downtown stages, polka, lederhosen, hot air balloons, food, games, contests, carnival rides, and more. Rich with a strong German heritage, Dubois County offers attractions that will make this tour one you will remember for years to come!

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, visit **St. Joseph Catholic Church**, a magnificent 1880 Romanesque, old-world-style church built by the early parishioners and showcases priceless German stained-glass windows. Other features include Austrian-designed and imported mosaics with 50 million stones, pewter and marble statues, altars made of Italian marble, and a communion railing of onyx and brass. Today the church is home to nearly 5,000 parishioners

New to Jasper and just a few blocks from the downtown square are the beautiful **River Centre** and **Thyen-Clark Cultural Center**, built along the banks of the Patoka River. The cultural center is home to the Jasper Arts Center, featuring art galleries displaying national, regional & local art and the Jasper Public Library. Also, along the Patoka take a stroll on the Jasper Riverwalk & stop at the **Jasper City Mill**. Visit the thriving downtown square in Jasper, boasting with local specialty stores featuring a chocolate & kitchen shop, clothing boutiques, gift & décor shops and more.

The **Dubois County Museum**, a German Culture and Heritage Center, will blow you away as you browse the different exhibits throughout the 50,000 sq. foot building. Permanent exhibits include history, agriculture, military, woodworking, sports, and German heritage. The newest exhibit added, “Wildlife Adventure Room,” features a collection of animals a local game hunter, Frank Fromme, collected from all over the world.

A short drive to Ferdinand (13 miles from Jasper), visit the **Monastery Immaculate Conception**, a castle-like structure featuring a beautiful domed church. The Monastery is home to one of the nation’s largest group of Benedictine women, known as the Sisters of St. Benedict. Browse their gift shop offering religious & artisan cookies & food items. A new addition on the Monastery Grounds is St. Benedict’s Brew Works, the only U.S. craft brewery on the grounds of a women’s religious community offering a variety of craft beers.

Explore a city like no other, Huntingburg, Indiana (7 miles from Jasper) home of **Huntingburg League Stadium**, where “A League of Their Own,” starring Tom Hanks and Geena Davis, was filmed. The stadium was the home field to the Rockford Peaches in the movie. Catch a collegiate baseball game at League Stadium on July 13, 14, 16 or 17<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm EST. The team plays in retro styled uniforms to bring you back to the era depicted in the movie, while the Peaches entertain fans in the stadium.

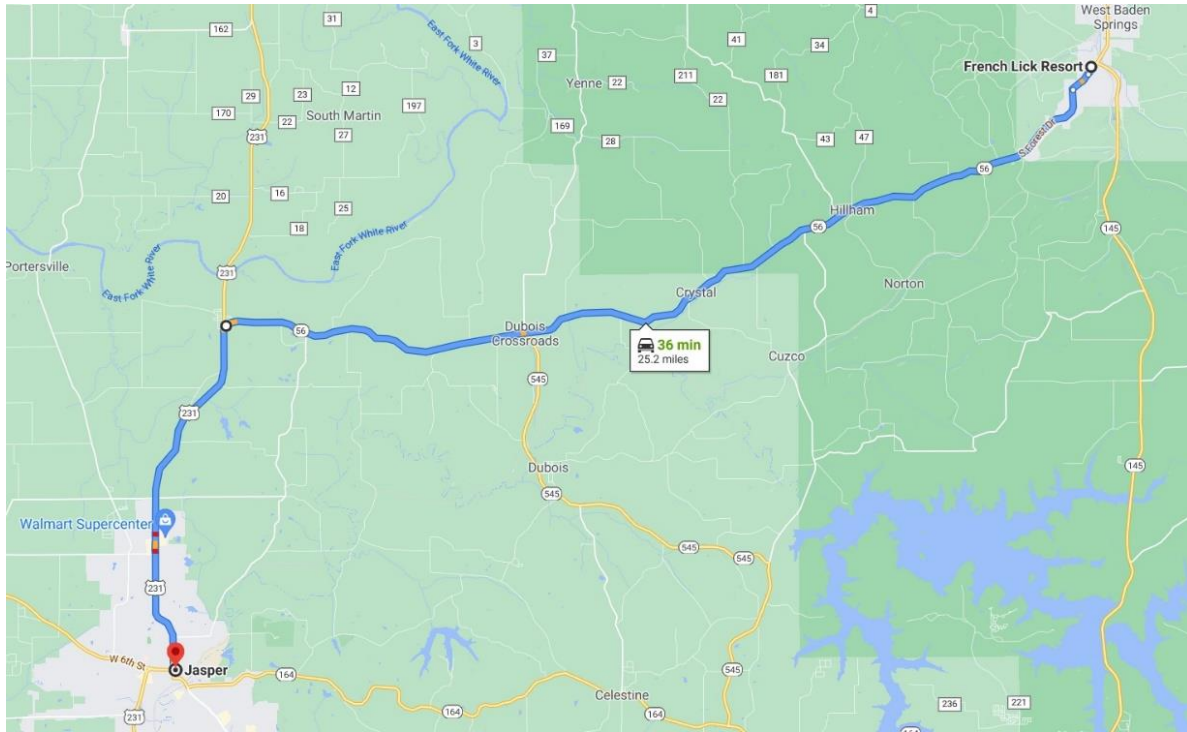

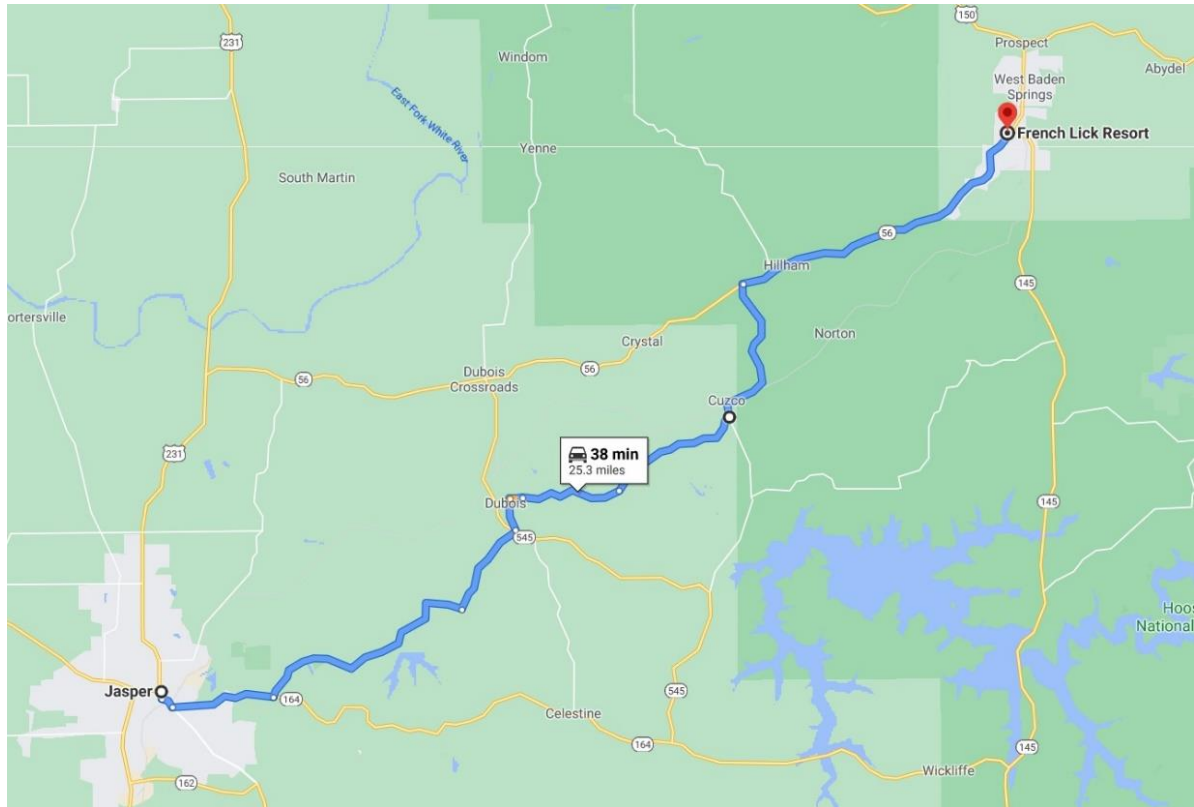
## DESTINATION-DRIVE to JASPER, INDIANA



Depart the French Lick Resort

1. Head south from the Resort toward **Indiana Ave/IN-56 W** (250 feet)
2. Turn right onto **Indiana Ave/IN-56 W** (18 miles)
3. Turn left onto **US-231 S** (6.8 miles)
4. Turn left onto **W 7<sup>th</sup> St** (300 feet)
5. Turn right onto **Main St** (150 feet)
6. Turn right onto **Courthouse Square**

## RETURN TO FRENCH LICK RESORT



Depart Jasper, Indiana Courthouse Square

1. Turn right onto **Main St** (0.1 mile)
2. Turn left onto **3<sup>rd</sup> Ave** (0.3 mile)
3. Turn left onto **IN-164 E/2nd Ave** (2.1 miles)
4. Turn left onto **E Jasper Dubois Rd** (4.9 miles)
5. Turn left to stay on **E Jasper Dubois Rd** (2.0 miles)
6. Continue onto **N 4th St** (0.7 mile)
7. Turn right onto **E Vine St** (0.3 mile)
8. Continue onto **E Dubois Cuzco Rd** (2.1 miles)
9. Slight left to stay on **E Dubois Cuzco Rd** (2.8 miles)
10. Turn left onto **N Cuzco Rd S** (3.3 miles)
11. Turn right onto **IN-56 E** (6.5 miles)
12. Turn left into French Lick Resort
